Synopsis:

A discussion of the many areas of forensic dentistry that go beyond the morgue walls and into the streets, police stations and your private practice. State and national level disaster preparedness and response will be overviewed. Missing and Unidentified Persons efforts through NCIC and NamUS will be explained. Interpersonal and Intimate Partner violence recognition and patient resourcing will be examined Incident reviews of large-scale fatalities and their management and outcomes will be overviewed. An examination of civil litigation in private dental practice and a discussion on risk management and professional liability for dentists and auxiliaries will also be reviewed.

- Improve the appreciation of accurate and well-maintained dental records for multiple applications to matters of law.
- Develop a greater understanding of the efforts of County, State and National systems for the management of Missing and Unidentified Persons.
